

Among her ideas for some-thing different were making a place mat made by pressing fresh flowers in a frame with a clear plastic (not glass) top. She likes using gerbern daistes best for this; they go the flattest and have bright, bold colors. Brown also strung beads from costume jewelry on wires and attached thom to silverware handles or formed them into

For a party dressed in "industrial chic," Brown covered small cork plant liners with silver tacks to make coasters and larger ones with thin sheet metal (that could be cut with a scissors) to make place mats.

For a children's party, Brown made a centerpiece featuring pinwheels in terra cotta pots filled with sugar and jelly beans. Each place mat was made of four rulers glued together to form a rectangle or square, with colorful ribbons tied around each corner. Ice cream could be sorved in clear glass bowls glued onte toy cars.

Brown took questions from the audience. They included:

What window treatment can be done for such clements as sliding glass doors or French doors? Brown suggested putting rods at the top and bottom and fabric between them; the rods could be turned away from the glass as needed.

What about a bachelorette party? One of Browns ideas was to have each guest write up a story about the honere and put them in a scrapbook. At the party, everybody would read their story.

Any ideas for a shower in March? Brown suggested dipping bottles in bright marine paint, grouping three together and securing them with wire to make a centerpiece that guests could take home. This is featured in the book.
