Hope for the Jews during the time of the Maccabees came in the eight days of light of the candles in the temple; this miracle where hope provailed is remembered in the celebration of Hanukkah. Hope for Jane Goodall, who did so much work with chimpanzees in Africa comes from what she seems so resilient; the enthusiasm of young people for life, just to name a few. Hope for the Christians is profoundly placed in the centrality of Jesus, as the Christ and the way in which Christians find that presence to be experienced in each generation.
