FLORISSA MILLER

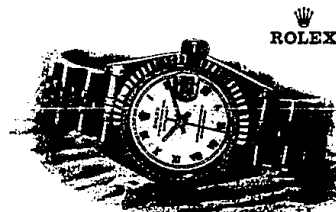

Supplies sought for earthquake relief

Students at two local schools are collecting donations for earthquake relief in India.

The quake hit on Jan. 26 as many cities were celebrating India's 51st Republic Day. Measuring 7.9 on the Richter Scale with the epicenter in Bhuj, Gujarat, it was felt all over India. Based on news reports as many as 100,000 could be killed and 200,000 may be injured.

The Indian Consulate has granted the schools permission to send medical, bedding and nonperishable food items to Gujarat. Cash donations are also being accepted which will be tax exempt from the IRS.

Towne Air Freight will transport all of these items to Air India in Chicago on the weekend of

Feb. 10.

Any of the following items may be sent to Beechview Elementary or East Middle School, in boxes:

Medicines, such as antibiotics, pain relievers, antacid, asthma medicine, bandages, syringes, oral dehydration kits, dysentery/diarrhea prevention medicine, plaster, first-aid kits and orthopedic medical equipment, etc.; light weight tents, sleeping bags, tarpaulins, working gloves for those searching through debris; nonperishable food items that are not in glass containers (Gujarat is mainly a vegetarian state).
