# Mustangs win title; Observerland champions 3rd in WLAA tourney

## WRESTLING

It figured to be a battle with a few of the Western Lakes Activities Association's Western Division team vying for top honors at Saturday's WLAA Wrestling Tournament, hosted by Walled Lake Central.

But it wasn't all that close. Plymouth Canton and Northville figured to be the top teams, with Walled Lake Western, Livonia Churchill, Plymouth Salem and Livonia Stevenson in the next tier. But a depleted Canton squad, missing two starters and with several others in "questionable health," according to coach John Demick, offered little challenge to Northville.

Indeed, a Western team the Chiefs had defeated 49-24 in a dual meet in January, was able to edge them by a point for second place. Finishing behind Canton was Salem in fourth, followed by Stevenson and Churchill.

"We have a lot in our guys," said Demick. "We felt we could have won with the guys we took. We ended up with five guys in the finals, (but) with only two more going for third/fourth consolations, compared to our normal 10 or 11

guys in the finals and consolations.

"You don't win tournaments with only seven guys in the finals (and consolations). Northville did what it had to do. We definitely messed up in some places and are definitely disappointed, but we still believe in our guys."

The Chiefs had just one champion: Greg Musser, who emerged with the title in the 140-pound division. Musser defeated Livonia Stevenson's Matt Bailey 8-3 in the championship bout.

Four others lost in the title match: Doy Demick at 125, Scott McKee at 171, Phil Rothwell at 189 and Derek McWatt at 275. Chris Hossey, wrestling at 125, and Mike Siegrist, at 145, both placed third.

The Rocks outdid Canton by collecting three division titles. Tony Kennard was the top wrestler at 135, beating Livonia Churchill's Lev Mergian 11-2 in the final.

At 130, Brandon Sammut defeated Livonia Franklin's Lee Warren 3-2 in the title match.

And at 119, Mike Gootho topped Northville's D'Anna 2-1 in overtime.

However, the Rocks had no one else finish higher than fourth.

Churchill and Stevenson each had one division champion. At 215, the Chargers' Thom Vandenbosche and the Spartans' Mike Bargerstock tangled in the title bout. Vandenbosche emerged with the win, pinning Bargerstock in 5:15.

At 160, Stevenson's Imad Kharbush was the champion, pinning Farmington's Mike Murtland in 1:20 in the final. Chris Coopder of Stevenson also made it to the title match at 145 before losing.

## CC rolls to league title

For the 20th time in the last 29 years, Catholic Central walked away with the Catholic League Wrestling title.

CC won it easily with 224 points. Host Dearborn Divine Child was second with 132 and Birmingham Brother Rice third.

"It wasn't easy," said CC coach Mike Rodriguez. "It appears to be, but it wasn't. Harper Woods Notre Dame

came in on fire and had three kids who were really ready. I wondered if our kids would come up to the occasion, and they did. Everyone contributed — even the kids who lost early came back to win points."

CC finished fourth or better in all but one weight class and came away with five winners on the day, including Ryan Rogowski at 171, who beat Orchard Lake St. Mary's Matt Ulrey, 6-1, in the final and earned most valuable wrestler honors in the upper weights.

The Shamrockers also got a title from Tim Mulroy, a 10-8 winner over Notre Dame's Dan Hughes at 119; Mike Werner, who pinned Divine Child's Mario Perez in 3:05; Jay Abshire, a 9-3 winner at 145 pounds against Mark Husocki of Madison Heights Bishop Foley; and Chris Cracchiolo, an 11-6 winner over Notre Dame's Kyle Smith.

CC also got seconds from Matt Kozlars (103), Jason Hilliker (160) and Matt Markowicz (189), thirds from Tom Buddenberg (125), Ben Kruecher (130) and Chris Petersen (140) and fourths from Pat Clark (275) and Nick Crawford (112).
