

# Flyers trounce Panthers, 9-0

Farmington Unified climbed back to .500 in high school hockey Wednesday by defeating Lapeer West in a makeup game, 9-0.

The Flyers moved closer to their goal of finishing the season with a winning record by improving their overall standing to 9-9-3.

Farmington had three games remaining in the regular season, the first of which was a Saturday meeting with Dearborn. The Wednesday game featured an outstanding team effort, according to Flyers coach Mike Harris.

Devin Baker scored a hat trick and also had an assist, and goalie Greg Diven posted his second shutout.

Farmington's Preston Picard had one goal and three assists. Brian Marion and Keith Hay had one goal and one assist each, and Matt Lee also had three assists.

The host Flyers had just a one-

goal lead after one period following an unassisted goal by Picard at 2:22.

Farmington exploded for four goals in the second period by Scott Patterson (Karl Maus, Marion), Baker (Lee, Picard), Brad Heraghty (Lee, Baker), and Glenn Hearn (Hay, Brett Ramsey).

Hay (unassisted), Baker (Kirk Laird, Picard), Baker (Lee) and Marion (Picard) added to the Farmington total in the third period.

Each team had just one penalty through two periods, the Panthers picked up four more in the final period and the Flyers three.
