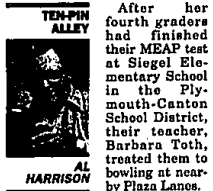


Nobody gets an A, but students are treated to 300 game

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. C-1-2001

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned:

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show RA-2B District classification where RA-1 Single-Family Residential District classification is now shown in the area defined as follows:

Sidewalks #23-11-101-020 to 029, 032, 045; 23-11-102-001 to 014, 019 to 022; 23-11-104-006, 007, 011, 028; 23-11-152-006 to 014; 23-11-163-001 to 003, 005 to 016; 23-11-174-001 to 009, 009, 010, 012, 014, 016; 23-11-177-001 to 006; 23-11-301-006 to 008, 017, 018; 23-11-302-001 to 011; 23-11-326-001, 003 to 009; 23-11-351-017 to 020, 023 to 029, 036 to 038; 23-11-352-001 to 006, 006 to 015, 019 to 028; 23-11-378-001 to 009, 011, 012, 016, 019, 024, 025, 030, 031; 23-11-377-001 to 016; 23-11-451-01 to 010, 012, 162 to 164; 23-11-482-001 to 011, 013, 014, 025, 028

A part of Section 1, TIM ROE, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan. The property concerned is located between Twelve and Thirteen Mile Roads, east of Orchard Lake Road.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 14th day of February, 2001, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
