the county in the to and from Happy Valley was well worth it for Terek, who soared 18 feet, 24, inches in the pole vault to break the 1995 Big Ten indoor mork set in 1995 when Indiano's Mark Buse did 18-24. "Terek's own MSU school record, previously set last month at 17-34, fell by he wayside along with the PSU facility mark. With three events left to run

in Sunday's heptathlon, Terek also set an NCAA mark by clearing 17-8\(^1\) in the pole vault. He tried to tie the world indoor heptathlon record when he narrowly missed at an attempt of 18-4\(^1\). Terek now sets his sights on the NCAA Indoors March 9-10 in Fayetteville, Ark, where he comes in an automatic qualifier for the first time. This season he ranks only second in the NCAA to Jacob Paul of Northern Iowa, who has cleared 18-4\(^1\). "After my performance this weekend I'm crazy enough now to feel that I can win," Terek said of the upcoming NCAAs. "I'm sure after not even being ranked in the top 20 or 40 (pole vaulters), they think that I'm a fluke.

"But if I physically and men-

tally feel great, I don't think anybody can beat me. Last weekend my technique was not great, 
but I had a lot of clearance. I didn't feel as good as I could, but if 
both come together I feel I have 
as good a shot as anybody."

into State College, Terek got off 
the bus with sore legs and a stiff 
back.

"Once we got over to the track and jogged around a little bit, I felt pretty good," Terek said. Plus, the Penn State facility is great.

Besides his 10 jumps Saturday in the vault, Terek competed in four events in the heptathlon and ran a leg in the distance medley relay as MSU finished fourth in 9:50.1.

Terek had the best lopg jump of the day in the heptathlon at 22-74 and was third best in both the shot put (45-104) and 60-meter dash (7.18). He also cleared 6-34 in the high jump,

good enough for eighth place.
On Sunday, Terek took a 10th in his weakest event, the 66-meter hurdles (8.74), won the pole vault, and flinched the Big Ten heptathlon championship by finishing fourth in the 1,000 run. Terek totaled 5,685 points; Minnesota's Lyndon McDowell was the runner-up with 5,593.
'I had to run 10 second better than McDowell to hold onto the first place,' Torek said. 'He cruised by me like he was on a jog, so I sped up and tried to stay with him. It started to hur really bad.'

McDowell edged Terek at the line, but the title went to Terek. The bus ride back provided lit-
