Granville Island didn't used to be so grand. The island started out as a sandbar in False Creek used by the natives of Sang village to trap beaver, ducks and muskrat and fish for trout and sturgeon. By the 1920s, due to its access to barge traffic, it had evolved into an industrial mecan with some of the largest manufacturing operations in the area. Starting in the 1950s the island began to decline. It no longer made sense to have large manufacturing companies in the middle of the city and freeway access was more important and quicker than shipping by barge.
