

Suspect sought in indecent exposure

Farmington Hills Police are warning families in the area of Gill Elementary School, east of Farmington Road, about a man who has been exposing himself to children.

On March 12, 8 a.m., a man described as white, 30-40 years old, 6-foot-tall, with a "chunky" build, brown hair and a bald spot, exposed himself to an 11-year-old girl. A similar incident, involving two 10-year-old girls, happened on February 12.

Police say parents should warn children not to respond to offers or requests made by strangers and avoid people they do not recognize, strangers in cars or unfamiliar settings. Children are urged to go directly home from school and check in before going out to play, always walk with others students, and immediately report any approach made by a stranger.

The following reports were filed during the past week with the Farmington Hills Police Department:

ATTEMPTED RAPE

A 14-year-old Novi girl told police Monday, March 12, that she was sexually assaulted the day before while working at the Farmington Hills McDonald's at 38400 10 Mile Road.

The girl said a 21-year-old male co-worker assaulted her four times in a little more than an hour while the two worked at McDonald's. The assaults gradu-

ated in intensity until the suspect dropped his pants and tried to pull the pants off the girl. She resisted each time by pushing him away and yelling "No!"

The restaurant manager intervened at least twice, telling the male employee to go away. The girl "sought refuge with the manager until the end of her shift," the police report said. She told the story to her aunt and legal guardian, who brought her to the police department.

Police had not arrested a suspect at press time.

CARIACKING

Livonia police arrested a 38-year-old Redford man the night of Friday, March 9, after finding him in a 1993 GMC Sonoma that was reported stolen in Farmington Hills earlier that evening.

The man was turned over to Farmington Hills police, who charged him with auto theft.

The victim, a 40-year-old resident in the 21000 block of Rockwell, told police he was skinning rabbits in the back yard when he heard the door of the truck close. He confronted a man who was pushing the truck out of the driveway. The man punched him in the face, knocking him down. The suspect drove off in the truck. The victim called police.

HOME INVASION

A 35-year-old female resident of the RC Mobile Home Park on Renaissance south of Nine Mile told police that two men knocked on her door March 9 asking for

money.

She said she had none, but the men forced their way into her trailer and took \$180 from the table. They warned her not to call the police and left. Police believe the carjacking suspect in the previous item was one of these men.

BREAK-IN

A member of a home construction crew told police that a construction trailer was broken into the night of March 8-9 on Middlebelt north of 12 Mile Road.

Power tools worth \$2,900 were missing. The thief is believed to have gained entry by moving a fork-lift that blocked the door and breaking the brackets that held the lock on the door.

BB GUNS

A Hills resident in the 23000 block of San Souci told police March 9 he suspects neighborhood teenage boys of shooting the headlight out of a car parked in his driveway with a BB or pellet gun. He also believes the boys had been shooting birds on his feeder.

Police arrested three Hills teens after they admitted to driving around in the vicinity of the 28000 block of Hawberry shooting at birds with a Crossman 760 Pumpmaster BB gun.

Police were tipped off by a Hawberry resident who called to say the boys pointed a gun at her house.

INJURY ACCIDENT

A 67-year-old Hills man was taken to Botsford Hospital after slumping over at the wheel of his pick-up truck, crossing the westbound lanes of Grand River and striking a concrete wall over 1275 at 1 p.m. March 9.

The man was unconscious and not breathing when the officer arrived. The officer gave CPR to the man. Paramedics restarted the man's heart with a defibrillator.

ATTEMPTED BREAK-IN

The resident of a house in the 28000 block of Shilwassee told police March 10 that someone attempted to break into his garage.

The padlock on the door was damaged, and there was a small puncture in the door behind the lock. Entry was not gained, and nothing was missing.

CRACK POSSESSION

Police arrested a 34-year-old Detroit man March 10 after finding 0.7 gram of crack cocaine in his sock.

The man was a passenger in a 1984 Ford Escort that was stopped on Grand River at Roosevelt for having a loud exhaust.

Neither driver nor passenger had identification or a driver's license. Both consented to being searched, the police report said.

A check of the Detroit man's record revealed a misdemeanor warrant out of Detroit, six license suspensions and two convictions for driving on a suspended license.
