quality, store in dry, cool cable nets away from the stove, refrigerator exhaust or where sunlight will hit during the day.

As a rule of thumb, low-acid canned foods can be kept for two to five years, including meet and yeagetables except tomato, potates, corn, carrots, beans, peas and pumpkin. High-acid canned or jarred foods such as tomato products, fruits, sauerkraut and items that are vinegar-based are safe for 12-18 months.

Never use canned foods that are in leaking, badly dented a bulging containers. Never taste such foods, throw them out!

Overstocking the cupboards contributes to this problem. Keep
