City seeks demolition of 9 Mile house

The beginning of the end may have come for a manufactured home on Nine Mile Read that has been driving neighbors to

has been driving neighbors to distraction.

On Thursday, 47th District. Court Magistrat Joan Dudley told a city representative that she'd sign an order for demolition of the house, which has been a neighborhood eyesore since being abandoned last year. City officials had issued a citation to clean up the property. It's the second time they've gone to court to force maintenance; last year, a ticket was issued for a lawn mowing violation.

Atlantic Mortgage, which acts as an agent for the federal government's Housing and Urban, Development agency, didn't; show up to answer the charges and hasn't responded to the demolition order.

"Wo've let Atlantic Mortgage know we have such an order, and will proceed," said City Manager Steve Brock. Atlantic could appeal the order, he added. "They're entitled to due process."

The manufactured home has

The manufactured home has been a focus of concern ever since it and several others were built in the Nine Mile-Karen Court area. They battle started with Keating Homes 13 years ago, over a variety of issues including conditions on the site during construction.

A fire, which officials believe started because of a leaking water heater, damaged the interior of the home. Neighbors have taken photographs of the inside of the home, which show the walls are covered with mold; They've approached officials quumber of times with concerns over whether mold spores could become airborns.
