

Mercy anticipates successful season

If first games are a good indication, Farmington Hills Mercy is headed for another winning season in lacrosse.

The Marlins, who opened Wednesday with a 9-4 victory over Brighton, finished second in Division B of the Michigan Women's Scholastic Lacrosse Association with a 9-1 record.

Mercy lost to Grosse Pointe North in the semifinals of the state tournament, ending with a 10-3 overall record.

This is the second year for the Mercy team, although the Marlins are considered to have one of the more established programs.

For several years, the Mercy girls were part of a combined team with players from Farmington Public Schools.

LACROSSE

When Farmington created its own varsity program a year ago, Mercy went its own way, but it took with it most of the experienced players.

Of the 55 girls on the former combined club team, 32 were from Mercy, which is why the Marlins were placed in Division B for schools with teams at least three years.

Lacrosse is recognized as a varsity sport at Mercy but has club status, meaning the program is self-funded and receives no support from the school.

The Marlins who played on the old unified team include seniors Jessica Beaman, Beth Choi, Julie Holland, Maggie Doady, Jill Whately and Nina Cherian.

and juniors Meg Parish, Stephanie Yuhaz, Rachel Holland, Kaitlyn Hayes, Sarah Fogoros and Kim Fino.

Yuhaz scored three goals in the Brighton game. Parish and Julie Holland each had two goals. Holland also had two assists. Accounting for the other goals were sophomores Lauren Berger and Nicki Hicks.

Mercy started the season with eight returning starters: Julie Holland, Beaman and Parish on offense; Choi, Berger and Rachel Holland in the midfield; Yuhaz or senior Melissa Wojnarowski at the center position and Fogoros on defense.

Other returning players are sophomores Erin McCann and Chelsea Babbish. The new players include senior Yolanda Chapman, juniors Vanessa Slatin and Dana Karagiosian (goalie), sophomores Kate Detskias, Hicks, Abbey Kelley, Jackie Smith, Karen Kudelko and Barb Mazz-

ka and freshman Emelia Ward.

"There's still enough new people who've only been playing one year, and they're holding their own, doing fine," said coach Kim Norton, who also coached the former combined club team.

"They just need to have more games under their belt."

"For the first game, we did very well passing, playing good defense and putting an offense together. We'll be a little sharper with more game experience."

Every school that competes in lacrosse is in the MWSLA; therefore, the state tournament for Division B teams involves the same ones Mercy plays in league games — Ann Arbor, Bloomfield Hills, LaSalle, Brighton, Grosse Pointe North, Birmingham Marian, Troy Athens and Troy.

Troy was the only division team to defeat Mercy last year. However, Marian won the Division B state title and returns its entire team, according to Norton.


