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License plate would raise research funds

License plates to help raise money for cancer research have been proposed by state Rep. Andrew Raczowski.

"Cancer is a pervasive disease that knows no societal or economic boundaries," said Raczowski, R-Farmington Hills. "There isn't anyone in the state that has not been affected by cancer in some way. This plate will help fund promising research and give Michigan residents and families hope for the future."

Many local residents are coping with the aftermath of cancer in their families, Raczowski said. An Oakland County woman who lost her mother to breast cancer is raising cancer awareness by participating in a 60-mile walk, and a Raczowski staffer recently lost his mother to breast cancer.

Proceeds from the cancer fund-raising license plate would go to educational, public and private institutions that are looking for cures for cancer. A portion of the money would go to public and private hospice organizations.



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
