This 30-year elementary school teacher and now full-time chef is currently at Cokerland Community College as one of more than 200 aspiring women chefs to submit an original recipe to the competition. She's one of 10 chefs to have the chance to win a scholarship and travel to the famed Culinary School, Le Cordon Bleu and a month-long apprenticeship to executive chef Diane Forley at Verbena in New York City.

To enter, chefs were asked to submit a recipe using Alize's brandy, which she chose. A beverage that blends fruit, cognac and passion fruit juice, Alize Red Passion, which adds

cranberry to the original blend, or Alize's cognac as an ingredient.

Triple grand terrine

Boguslawski began experimenting with all of the Alize line. Her winning entry was Alize Triple Grand Terrine. The 10 semifinalist entries are now being judged by a panel including Sara Moulton of TVFN's *Cooking Live*, Anne Rosenzweig of *Food Network* and Amy Stauberg of the 21 Club.

Once the judging panel has narrowed down the field to the top three entries, those chefs will be brought to New York City to prepare their recipe for testing. The winner will be announced at a luncheon at Verbena Restaurant.
