Traffic signal project won't burden Farmington taxpayers

While traffic signals in the City of Farmington will be re-timed, residents won't bear the

timed, residents won't bear the cost. The Oakland County Road Commission and the Michigan Department of Transportation, together with other Oakland County communities, will seen retime about 1,000 non-Fast Trae signals in the county. The project is 100 percent fed-erally funded and scheduled to be completed in 2002," according to Farmington City Manager Frank Lauhoff. Craig Bryson, an Oakland

He contrasted fixed signals with Fast Trac signals, which don't need retiming because they are more advanced and comput-erized with the ability to retime themselves according to traffic level.
