Plymouth Salem opened its Western Lakes Activities Association Lakes Division season the same way it played four of its previous five opponents — winning by shutout.

In this instance, it was the Farmington Falcons who were on the low end of the 0-0 score Monday. Six players scored for the Rocks, who led just 1-0 at the half.

Salem improves to 4-1 overall, 2-0 in the WLLA and 1-0 in the division. Farmington is 4-2 overall, 2-1 in the WLLA and 0-1 in the division.

Marissa Sarskalan and Danielle Portelli each had a goal and an assist. Stephanie Baron, Janae Bucks, Shara Huggins and Kellie Mullin added a goal apiece.

For keeper Jill Dombrowski, the shutout was her fourth of the season.

Holly Deedler's bases-loaded grounder drove in the winning run Monday as host Westland John Glenn edged Farmington in eight innings, 6-4.

The Rockets loaded the bases with two walks and an infield hit. Deedler hit the ball to shortstop, giving Amanda Ross time to reach home plate with the game-winner.

Ruth Ann Kietlyka pitched a complete game for Glenn, as did Kelsey Guisbert for Farmington. Kietlyka struck out three and didn't give up a walk; Guisbert had seven walks and two strikeouts.

Glenn had just four hits but made the most of them. Abby Massey and Sarah Walter knocked in one run each with base hits; Erica Novack and Kathryn Fowler accounted for the other hits.

The Falcons produced 11 hits, including two apiece by Randin Brown, Danielle Lewis and Guisbert. Lewis, Ashleigh Bartlett, Guisbert and Adrienne Shaw had one RBI each.

"That's the way it's going to be for us," Glenn coach John Albrecht said, regarding the disparity in hits. He added the Rockets don't have a lot of pitching speed, "but sometimes that works to our advantage."

"We just need to go back and

work on fielding. We have to go and catch the ball. If we do that, we do pretty well."

Albrecht added Walter, a junior catcher, has thrown out 11 of 13 runners attempting to steal this season when Glenn has tried to make a play.

The Rockets are 2-0 in the Western Lakes Activities Association Lakes Division, 2-1 in the WLLA and 3-6 overall. The Falcons are 0-1, 0-2 and 0-2, respectively.
