"It was a unique situation, I'm very proud. In that kind of situation, I thought it might have been one of the better performances from a team I've been involved in. I was shocked and not certainly disappointed in the way the kids performed. We did what we had to do."

"The officials said that was the way it had to be, so we didn't have a choice. We had to run with what we had. A lot of kids didn't have spikes or uniforms. Even the officials complimented us. They said they didn't know how we did it."

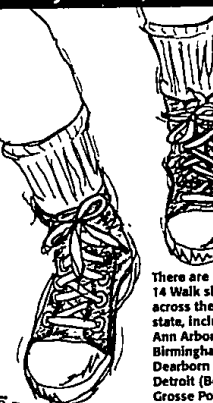
