Mercy wins Jackson Invitational title:

For the first time since 1988 — that's how long the Farmington Hills Mercy track team has been competing in the annual Jackson Invitational — the Martins finally won the meet Friday night.

"We've been second about eight times, so it's pretty exciting to win it once," Mercy coach Gary Servais said.

Mercy racked up 118 points in the nine-team competition to finish well ahead of runner-up Portage Northern.

"We still dight have everyone there, and not everyone stayed at the meet," Servais said. "Some had schedule conflicts and had to leave early, and others dight make the trip who could have helped us. That's the scary part."

Morey's Whitney Johnson set a school record of 47.6 seconds in winning the 300-meter hurdles. She shattered the record proviously shared by Tracey Balog and Jami Snow of 49.1.

"That's only the second time she's done the 300 hurdles, and it was the first time she's worn spikes, Servais said.

Judy Telford won the shot put and discus, and she had a personal best in the shot put this season.

Alexandria Marshall won the 400 dash and was second in the 100 and 200. Her time in the 400 is the best in the area this year, and she was on the winning 1,600 relay team that also posted an area-best time.
