

Hill and Dale Garden Club offers tips

These garden tips come courtesy of the Hill and Dale Garden Club of Farmington, a member of the Federated Garden Clubs of Michigan.

■ Begin to harden off warm-season vegetable and flower transplants from cold frame or pot flats in sunny, protective areas - but bring them back in at night.

■ Pansies, azaleas and rhododendrons can be planted. Wait until May 15 to chance begonias and impatiens. If danger of frost,

cover with sheeting.

■ If you plant bare-root roses, soak in water for several hours before planting.

■ When peonies reach 10 inches, stake or hoop to support blossoms.

■ Divide mature summer- and fall-blooming perennials - not daylilies (September). Oriental poppies (July) or Iris (July).

■ Fertilize spring-flowering bulbs with 5-10-5 or 10-10-10 mix when finished flowering.

■ Continue to remove garden

debris from last year.

■ Use weed and feed now to control future weeds. After the application, you may have to hand pull or spot treat remaining weeds.

■ Houseplants can remain outside during the day, but watch temperatures at night - not below 40 degrees. If in doubt, wait until mid-May.

■ If orchids have finished flowering, fertilize regularly with dilute orchid fertilizer with every watering.
