

FARMINGTON HILLS POLICE CALLS

The following incidents were reported over the past week to the Farmington Hills Police Department:

AUTO THEFT
A 1997 Honda Accord was reported stolen 7:04 a.m. on Monday, May 7, from a residence at 39300 Village Green. The owner told police that the theft occurred overnight.

LARCENY
Copper pipes valued at \$1,416 were reported stolen from a construction trailer owned by Ecker Mechanical. The trailer was parked at 26900 Oakcrest Drive. A lock on the rear door of the trailer had been pried open. The theft was reported to police at 1:04 p.m. on Monday.

THEFT
Patio furniture and gas grill were reported stolen on Monday from a back porch in the 21500 block of Rensselaer. Police have no suspects in the theft.

STOLEN GAS
A young white male driving a red Acura drove away without paying for gas at the Marathon gas station at 29420 10 Mile Road. The incident occurred Monday, May 7, at 2:35 p.m.

ASSAULT AND BATTERY
An ongoing disagreement between two 13-year-old boys turned into an assault on Grand River near Independence.

One student had been taunting the other, and making disparaging comments about the child's father. He later hit the boy with a closed fist. Both are students at East Middle School.

VANDALISM
A cargo van parked behind Paulauski Audio and Video at 37367 12 Mile road was spray painted down the side with green and black spray paint on Monday. The incident was reported to police at 3:24 p.m.

THREATS
A 42-year-old man was threatened by a group of juveniles who followed him to his home in the 34800 block of Pickford. He reported the threats to police at 3:52 p.m.

INDECENT EXPOSURE
A woman living in the Fairmont Park Apartments reported that a naked man in his late 50's had knocked on the window to her apartment and began masturbating. She described the man as looking like a "hippie" - skinny with very long hair.

BREAKING AND ENTERING
Police arrested a 26-year-old man after he broke into a mobile home at 26930 Grand River. He gained entrance through the living room window.

He was found by the cops watching television and smoking marijuana. He had two "baggies"

of marijuana in his possession. The owner of the home's daughter noticed the missing front window and called police. The arrested man had outstanding misdemeanor warrants, according to police.

ART THEFT
Eleven pieces of art, valued at about \$15,000, was reported missing from several rooms in a home in the 28900 block of Rockledge. The home showed no signs of forced entry. The owner has photographs of most of the missing art work.

The theft was reported to police at Sunday, May 6 at 11 a.m.

CHILD NEGLECT
A routine traffic stop resulted in the arrest of a Farmington Hills man on an outstanding warrant for child neglect. The 36-year-old man was stopped while driving a vehicle with a woman standing on the rear bumper.

When officers ran the man's license, they discovered the outstanding arrest warrant from Big Rapids, Mich.

He was arrested and taken into custody on Sunday, May 6 at 6:51 p.m.

NARCOTICS ARREST
Police arrested a 26-year-old Detroit man and his 25-year-old Redford man for possession of crack cocaine.

The men were initially stopped because of erratic driving and an

obscured license plate. When officers discovered that the driver was operating the vehicle in violation of restrictions on his license, they searched the car.

Police found a small black case containing a crack pipe and a crack cocaine. Additional rocks of cocaine was found in a dashboard cup holder.

The driver of the car was also found to have three outstanding criminal warrants.

Both men were arrested and taken into custody by Farmington Hills police.

STOLEN GAS
At about 8:30 a.m. Thursday, May 3, someone in a white Cadillac Catera drove away from the Mobil gas station, 33350 12 Mile Road, without paying for \$22.69 worth of gas. The Catera was seen going westbound on Farmington Road.

Meanwhile, the driver of a purple Dodge Neon drove off without paying for approximately \$11 in gas pumped about 10:10 a.m. Thursday, May 3 at the Speedway station, 29250 Eight Mile Road.

DRUNKEN DRIVING
Police arrested a 24-year-old Novi man for drunken driving about 1:30 a.m. Tuesday, May 1, following a traffic stop on Orchard Lake south of 11 Mile.

The man was spotted making an improper right-hand turn off of 10 Mile onto Orchard Lake, and was subsequently swerving and crossing the yellow line. A strong odor of intoxicants was

evident inside the vehicle and he then struggled with field sobriety tests. His blood alcohol level was estimated at .18 percent.

NARCOTICS CRIME
A crack pipe was found during a search of a 38-year-old Detroit man, who had been arrested for driving with a suspended license. Police stopped the vehicle on Grand River east of Middlebelt Road at about 9:45 p.m. Wednesday, May 2.

DRUNKEN DRIVING
Police arrested a 39-year-old Westland man for drunk driving, about 1:10 a.m. Monday, April 30.

The driver also was cited for drunken driving with a minor in the vehicle. When police stopped the car, passengers included his 30-year-old wife and 2-year-old son. According to reports, police stopped a 1985 Chevy with no tail lights, which was weaving into other lanes on westbound Grand River east of Middlebelt Road.

The driver had bloodshot eyes and a strong odor of intoxicants came from inside the car. He told the officer that he had had "a few beers" at a party. His blood alcohol count was estimated at .12 percent.

A hearing date was set for 9 a.m. Friday in 47th District Court.
