

CC in league baseball final

Next up for Redford Catholic Central's baseball team is another peak at John Pico. CC won its way into the Catholic League AA Division championship game at 12:30 p.m. Thursday and will play Windsor (Ontario) Villanova in the title game. Villanova will almost certainly pitch Pico, a left-hander who should get drafted by some pro baseball team somewhere in the first 10 rounds of next month's major league draft. Pico is 1-1 lifetime against the Shamrocks, having lost to them two years ago in the final at Tiger Stadium and owning a tournament victory last year.

CC (19-6) scored twice in the bottom of the seventh Wednesday to defeat Orchard Lake St. Mary's, 3-2, and advance to the championship game. Jake Viane and Anthony Coratti led off the inning with walks. J. T. Haellerman sacrificed but the throw to first went into right field and the Shamrocks wound up with runners on second and third and a tie score. Ryan Rogowski then lifted a sacrifice fly to left to bring in the winning run. "It's a loss on paper, but it was a win in our minds," OLSM coach Jeff Willis said. Mark Lundquist pitched another strong game for the

Eagles (13-15), only to suffer his third defeat in 11 decisions. Lundquist went the distance, allowing four hits and striking out six. Lundquist supplied much of OLSM's offense with a single, double and two runs scored. Rollin Garcia, Ryan Ferguson and Mike Markey also contributed singles in the game. Charlie Haeger earned the victory for CC, giving up three walks and five hits while striking out five. Rogowski, the only Shamrock with two hits, scored his team's first run. He singled leading off the third and came home on a double by Kevin Entemlager.

Levy defeated Kyle Wargo and Nathan Gudritz in three sets again, 7-6 (7-4), 3-6, 6-2. "They were the second-from-last match to come off the court," Shenton said, adding they gave North a 4-3 lead before Copeland's win. "For a couple sophomores, they've played extremely well in their first full year of varsity." In the No. 3 doubles final, North's Scott Stone and Matt Licavoli needed two sets instead of three to defeat Adam O'Donnell and Phil Gutowski, 6-4, 7-5. "This (Stone-Licavoli) team is not the flashiest, but they go in there and fight like no other and they get the job done," Shenton said. With a different team from the dual meet, Northville reversed the result against Alex Talwar and Andrew Dallas at No. 4 dou-

bles with a 2-6, 6-1, 6-0 win. The Raiders, who were fourth in the state last year, will compete in the Division II meet June 1-2 in Kalamazoo. Before they do that, they will attempt to extend another streak and win a fifth consecutive Western Lakes Activities Association title Tuesday at Livonia Stevenson and Schoolcraft College.

"This team is starting to play together and jell at the right time of the year," Shenton said. "We'll have to see what happens with the (state) tournament draw, but our kids will be ready to play." "I still think this team as a whole hasn't played its best tennis yet and is still doing very well."

5-goal 2nd half lifts North to 6-3 victory

North Farmington ended a scoring drought in girls soccer Wednesday by defeating Westland, 6-3. The teams were tied at half-time with one goal apiece, and it was a five-goal second half that won it for the Raiders. Nicole Adena scored the first two North goals; she also had an assist and a number of near-miss scoring chances. "Her intensity was a joy to watch," North coach Tim Russell said.

Kelly Hogan, Megan Callahan, Lauren McKinney and Ashley Lynch scored the last four goals for the Raiders, who are 1-3 in the Western Lakes Activities Association's Lakes Division. Hogan, who helped to control the midfield, and Callahan also had two assists each. McKinney scored her first varsity goal on a through-ball assist by Adena. McKinney crashed hard to the far post and finished to the opposite side of the net.

"Lynch's goal was very similar to McKinney's, a good, aggressive attack off the far post," Russell said. The Raiders learned their leading scorer, Lauren Hogan, is most likely out for the remainder of the season with a severe sprain. "I am very disappointed for her, because she worked incredibly hard to get ready for this season," Russell said. "I've been here seven years, and no one has ever prepared harder."

"The good news is that she has another year to show her skills." North will have forward Sara Jakub back following a bout with bronchitis, however. "Her speed, skill, and energy will be a huge asset to us as we finish the season," Russell added. The Raiders have been working hard to generate offense since losing Lauren Hogan, an effort that was evident in the win over the Rockets, according to Russell. "We counted on her to create a great deal of the offense before she was injured," he said. "It's a shame we'll never know how good we could have been with her healthy, but I am very happy with the team offense we put together versus Glenn."

"After a few tough games, we had a team meeting. It really helped us to clear out some of the cobwebs. I believe we are ready for a very strong finish." The Glenn goals were scored by Lacey Catarino, Becky Jensen and Kristal Kilgore. Wednesday was Senior Farewell Night for the Raiders, who recognized Joyce Chung, Kelly Hogan, Anna Muir and Danielle Navas before the game. Chung, Hogan and Muir are four-year starters. Navas joined the team last season after two years on the JV.

STEVENSON 7, FARMINGTON 1: Livonia Stevenson (11-1, 5-0) completed an unbeaten season in the WLA Lakes Division with a victory Wednesday over visiting Farmington (11-5, 2-2). All-star Lindsay Gustik led the Spartans with three goals, while Christine Lewis and Bethany Dobson contributed a goal and one assist each. Lauren Valdivia and Stacie Perkins also added goals for Stevenson, which led 4-0 at intermission. Erica Rose scored for Farmington in the second half.

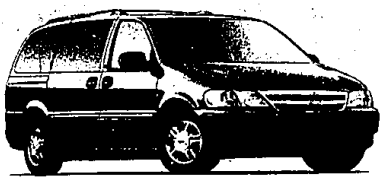
