Farmington Harrison won its second straight Division II regional title in boys track and field Friday with a dominating performance in the sprints and

performance in the sprints and relays.

The Hawks scored 123 points and easily outdistanced runner-up Warren Woods-Tower (103), as well as Warren Lincoln and Detroit Renaissance.

"One of our major goals was to win the regional, and we've been pointing toward it all season."
Harrison coach John Reed said.
"We accomplished a goal, so we're pretty happy.
"We're a school of 1,000 students, and it's hard when we go against teams with 2,000. It's hard to get the depth to win meets but, against the same-size schools, we do pretty well."

The Hawks dominated the 100-meter dash, with Marcus

The Hawks dominated the 100-meter dash, with Marcus Woods winning the race, Chris Roberson finishing third and Charles Pickett taking fourth. Terrill Mayberry won the 400 and Agim Shabaj the 200. They combined with Roberson and Woods to win the 800 relay and with Fernon Tate and Brian Coats to win the 1,600 relay.

Harrison won the 3,200- and 400-meter relays but had just two other first places, from Taria Devi in the shot put and Julieta Iarina in the pole vault.

The Hawks also were second in eight events, including the 800 and 1,600 relays. The top two finishers in each event, plus any additional qualifiers, advance to the state meet June 2 at Grand Rapids Forest Hills Northern.
