NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Regular School Election will be held in the Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, on Monday, June 11, 2001, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Eastern Time, for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the Board of Education for two four-year terms ending June 30, 2005 and for the purpose of submitting the following proposals to a vote of the qualified electors of the School District and the Community College:

FARMINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal would allow the renewal of the mills previously levied by the Board of Education of the Farmington Public School District for general operating purposes which expires with the District's 2001 tax levy. Under this proposal, the District would be allowed to levy the number of mills which would enable the District to receive revenues of the full foundation allowance permitted by the State.

As a renewal of previously approved authorization which expires with the 2001 tax levy, shall the limitation on the tax upon taxable property in the Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland be increased by 15 mills (\$18.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for five (5) years, the years 2002 to 2006, inclusive, to provide funds for operating expenses of the District? Of the 18 mill renewal, no more than 13.7352 mills (\$13.7352 per \$1,000 of taxable value) would continue to be permitted under existing law to be levied on homesteaded and qualified agricultural property. If approved, this millage would provide an estimated \$48,891,000 for the District in 2002.

OAKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow Oakland Community College to continue to impose a levy of up to 8.110 mills that was previously approved by voters in 1995 for operating purposes.

Shall Oakland Community College be authorized to levy taxes in an amount not to exceed Eighty Cents (\$.80) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) (0.8 mills) of the taxable value of all taxable property in the College District for a period of ten (10) years, 2002 through 2011, inclusive, as a renewal of that portion of the 0.8 mill authorization previously authorized by the electors not reduced by operation of the Headlee Amendment (which is estimated to be .7800 in 2001) plus an additional millage in the amount equal to the amount reduced by operation of the Headlee Amendment (which is estimated to be .0200 mills), to provide funds for all Community College purposes authorized by law? It is estimated that 0.8 mills would raise approximately \$34 million when first levied in 2002.
