Beatles tribute band featured

John, Paul, George and Ringo are back, as the group *Shout!* takes the stage as part of the Farmington Hills "Stars in the Park" free summer concert series on Thursday, June 14. The concert will take place in Heritage Park, on Farmington Road south of 11 Mile. The show begins at 8 p.m.

Shout! is the Beatles tribute band named top performers of over 40 bands competing at the Chicago Beatfest "Battle of the Bands" two years in a row. *Shout!* has awed Beatles fans from the Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C. to open-

ing act for Jefferson Starship, Lovin' Spoonful, Mitch Ryder and other groups.

Its tribute to the Fab Four includes authentic tailor-made costumes and vintage instruments. The group takes the audience from the Beatles' early songs to its more eclectic tunes. Members include John Manier (Paul), Kevin Kogur (Ringo), Rae Loeffler (George), and Aaron Ochoa (John).
