Being so close without winning in past years, Borowiec thought it might "always be a dream that never came true. It's nice to have done that and made it a reality."

Borowiec is probably the leading candidate to win the title of Miss Golf, which is determined by the coaches and should be announced later this week.

In winning the individual title, Borowiec also led her Mercy team to the state championship for the second time in three years.

"Going into this year, we knew we had a good chance," she said. She told her teammates: "If we work together and try hard, we can do this." They agreed with me, but I don't think they really believed it until late in the season.
