### New study

New study

Kaplan and Meier-Kriesche embarked on the new study to assess the long-term effect of the trend toward using the newer drugs. They used the USRDS, which until 1999 was based at UMHS, and which collects, analyzes and distributes data on end-stage renal disease and provides a basis for research like the new U-M study. The study's results, Kaplan and Meier-Kriesche say, offer

"strong advocacy" for the use of the newer form of cyclosporine over the old for niding long-term allograft survival, whether or not MMF is also taken.

"This reaffirms the important role of the calcineurin inhibitors, such ans cyclosporine and tacrolimus, for long-term survival of a transplanted kidney." Kaplan concludes.
