


in the 200, going 22.57. The conference and regional champ in both events, Shaw had an area best of 21.99 in the 200.

"Tim has natural ability, but he's also worked hard," coach Greg Hudkins said. "Last year he ran an 11.8 and has knocked off almost a second. He proved you can get faster with hard work."

Terrell Mayberry, 400 dash, Harrison: Mayberry finished second in the Division II state meet and set a school record with his time of 49.4 seconds.

He is the Farmington, WAAA and regional champion in the 400, and he was a member of the sprint relays.

"Terrell is a wonderful young man," Reed said. "He works very hard and has a tremendous focus on his performance. He's a joy to coach and to watch run."

Ryan Gail, 800 run, Churchill: Gail had the ninth-best time at the Division I state meet. He set a school record in winning the WAAA title with a time of 1:55.9.

"Ryan is a tremendously talented athlete," Austin said. "He has an awesome work ethic. I love his attitude and desire to win."

Dave Novara, 800 run, Stevenson: He placed seventh in the Division I state meet with a time of 1:57.12 after winning the Dearborn regional title with a clocking of 1:57.81. At the WAAA meet, Novara was runner-up to Gail at 1:57.6.

"Dave is a real hard worker and follows the race plan and race strategy to the letter," coach John Gores said.

Ryan Lowry, 1,600 run, Redford CC: For the last two years, Lowry has run in the shadow of his teammate Matt Daly.

"Most runners would be frustrated by that and likely become complacent," Magni said, "but he fed off the competition of his teammates and opponents to become one of the area's top runners."

Lowry placed seventh in the 1,600 run at the state finals in 4:21.0 and won the regional in 4:23.1. He was second in the Catholic League and won the Operation Friendship meet.

Matt Daly, 3,200 run, Redford CC: Daly proved he's one of the best in the Midwest as he won the Midwest Meet of Champions in Dayton, Ohio, in 9:17.56.

Daly placed third in the state in the 3,200 run in 9:17.7, won the regional for the second straight year — the same number of times he was the Catholic League champ in the 1,600 and 3,200.

"He's a leader on the track and in the classroom," Magni said. "His dedication extends beyond daily practice sessions."

RELAY TEAMS

400 relay, Farmington Harrison: Agim Shabaji, Chris Roberson, Charles Pickett and Marcus Woods won the Division II state title and set a meet record with its time of 42.66 seconds. The Hawks are city, league and regional champions.

"They're the fastest 400-meter relay team ever at Harrison," Reed said. "They're awesome to watch and a joy to coach. They're top quality young men."

800 relay, Bishop Borgess: The Spar-

tans won their second-straight state title and set a record this year by finishing in 1:29.69. They ran even faster in taking the regional crown in 1:29.3 and also won the Catholic League CD title.

1,600 relay, Farmington Harrison: Feron Tate, Brian Costa, Mayberry and

Shabaji won the Division II state championship while running the best time in Observerland at 3:23.8. The Hawks won city, league and regional titles.

"It's the finest 1,600-meter relay team ever at Harrison; they were undefeated the entire season," Reed said.

"They're tremendous young men who know how to pull together in big meets."

3,200 relay, Livonia Churchill: Phil Johnson is the only senior among this school-record quartet. Churchill finished seventh at the state meet with a time of 7:58.72. It was the WAAA champion.
