

POLICE CALLS

The following incidents were recently reported to the Farmington Hills Police Department:

NARCOTICS ARRESTS

The man had reportedly gotten into a physical fight with his wife, 64, and had attempted to choke her while she was driving them home from a reception, according to a police report.
