

Mariners win AABC district tournament

The 16-and-under Mariners overcame a first-round loss to win five straight games and the championship of an American Amateur Baseball Congress district tournament in Saginaw.

The first-place finish qualifies the Mariners, who have a dozen players from West Bloomfield and North Farmington high schools on their roster, for the AABC East Regional in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Following the opening loss to the Saginaw Panthers, the Mariners rebounded with a 4-1 victory over West Branch.

Matt Richard went 4-for-4 and drove in one run. Winning pitcher Alex Yerkey, Andrew Stanis and Max Zingle also had one RBI apiece.

In the next game, the Mariners and the Michigan Marauders were tied in the bottom of the seventh inning when Zingle's bases-loaded hit knocked in the winning run for a 4-3 victory.

Richard pitched six innings and was relieved by Joe Evangelista, who earned the decision. Jon Ong, Stanis and Richard batted in one run each.

The team's fourth game was more one-sided as the Mariners routed the Bri-Cor Orioles, 16-0.

Yerkey gained his second victory with relief help from Mike Rubin as they combined on a four-hitter. The Mariners had 12 hits and played errorless defense.

Evangelista pitched a complete game in a 6-1 victory over the South Farmington Blues, scattering five hits.

Justin Albarelli and Stanis paced the offense, each going 2-for-3; Evangelista, Aaron Friedman, Richard and Kyle Phillips

contributed one hit apiece. Yerkey went the distance against the Romeo Pirates in the championship game, earning his third win of the tournament as the Mariners prevailed, 8-2.

Yerkey, who was supported by error-free defense again, helped his cause by going 4-for-4 and driving in a run.

Friedman contributed three singles and two RBI. Stanis knocked in three runs with a double and a bases-loaded single, and Evangelista had two hits and one RBI.

Other contributors to the team effort were Gary Kennedy and Allan Wertheimer. The Mariners are coached by Dave Friedman, George Albarelli and Roger Zingle.

Cobras finish .500 in WS

The 16-year-old North Farmington-West Bloomfield Cobras finished 2-2 in pool play Saturday in the National Amateur Baseball Federation World Series.

But that record wasn't sufficient to advance the Cobras to the next round and qualify them for the semifinals Sunday in Northville.

NFWB lost its first game Saturday, its third of the tournament, to the Indianapolis Bulls, who eventually won the championship over the Dayton Classic.

The Cobras were winning with one out in the fourth inning, 1-0, when pitcher Ben Darga developed a stiff arm and had to be replaced.
