RAI sees mutual benefit from East mentorship program

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Farmington Hills relocation consulting firm RAI is among 40 area companies enlisted about the return this fall of a Farmington East Middle School student mentoring program.

"We had them sit in on one of our staff meetings. They really see what everyone else does," said RAI human resources manager Meredith Krug of the students who participated.

This is the fourth year for the mentoring program and the second year RAI is participating. Founded in West Bloomfield in 1979, RAI has been in Farmington Hills the past eight years.

The program begins in October, when participating mentor firms meet interested students at the school. Krug said meeting with students at the school is useful. "You remember the middle school experience and understand what their day involves," she said.

Once students are linked with a particular company, they visit every three weeks, Krug said.

Krug mentored a seventh-grade girl, and Monika Jones, another RAI employee, mentored an eighth-grade girl. Krug said the female-owned company has 20 employees, nearly all female, and management believes it's important to introduce adult, working women to young girls.

The student Krug mentored had her own e-mail account at RAI, sat in on staff meetings and even lunched at Wendy's with her mentor. One project involved organizing a canned food drive to benefit Horace Mann Elementary School in Detroit.

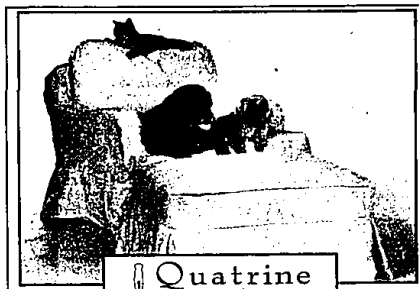
RAI contracts with companies

to settle employees transferred from other cities. "Many of our Ford clients end up residing in Farmington Hills," said Krug.

The firm provides information on everything from the cost of homes to information on schools. Krug said the benefit of participating in the mentoring program is "it's part of shaping the future."

"They see everything people in a business situation do," Krug said, adding the students also practiced going through job interviews.

The program is administered through Farmington East Middle School.
