Dance Theatre of Harlem, a favorite among Detroit audiences, will appear on the expansive stage of the Detroit Opera House Feb. 28-March 3, 2002. Although the Company has performed in various venues throughout the city, the 2002 appearance marks the first at the Detroit Opera House. Beginning as "one of ballet's most exciting undertakings" (New York Times, 1971), Dance Theatre of Harlem has grown into a multicultural company with a repertoire of 125 works. In its relatively brief history, the Company continues to fulfill its mandate to make the arts widely accessible to all populations. In 1988, Dance Theatre of Harlem became the first American Ballet Company to perform in the then

Soviet Union as part of the US/USSR Cultural Exchange Initiative.




