Barry ZeVan hopes he never has to take on the roles even though he's understudying both parts. ZoVan plays the patient in the doctor and tax examination


"I have 10 lines on my own and 1,400 to memorize of theirs," said ZeVan. "But there's no prima donna atmosphere."


