"Are you going to misapply the money of taxpayers for a golf course?" Johnston asked.


"There is millage money, \$1.5 million voted for this project, Brock said.

"We have a city-owned piece of property. We don't want condoon that precious green space."


But several council members said the planned 72 condo units on the parcel are important, as they'll help pay for the golf course and other planned improvements.
