receptionist said the caller may have electronically altered his voice to make it sound deeper.

LANDLORG CHAILERGE

An apartment tenant told farmington Hills police Sept. 12 he would not pay rent to his Pakistani landlord because he blames his people for the terrorist acts in New York and Washington, D.C.

The landlord, 42, told police the tenant threatened to harm him and refused to pay the rent "because Pakistan along with Afghanistan has harbored the terrorist who attacked his country." Folice advised the landlord to sock to holp through the courts to eviet the tenant.


