

Farmington wins 3rd in row

Farmington won its third consecutive game in girls basketball Thursday, doubling up Royal Oak Kimball in a non-league contest, 46-24.

Randin Brown and Brittaney Coleman scored 15 points apiece to lead the host Falcons, who are 5-3 overall. Julie Kimmel added 10 points and led the team with nine rebounds. Jaria Atkins, Denana Gauer and Lindsay Abbott chipped in seven rebounds apiece.

Farmington led 16-5 after one quarter, 28-7 at halftime and 44-14 going into the last period. "We had a chance to play everybody again," Falcons coach Scott Lowe said. "We were up by 20; we subdued a lot and a lot of kids got to play."

Jennifer Mangold led the Knights with 16 points, Farmington made 14 of 25 free throws, Kimball (3-6) four of 16.

Mercy wins again, too

Farmington Hills Mercy continued to ride the momentum generated by its victory over Livonia Ladywood in girls basketball Thursday.

The host Marlinns won their second game in a row, 54-35 over defending Catholic League champion Redford Bishop Borgess.

The Spartans, who are winless in four games, lost a number of key players from last year's team to Detroit Benedictine, however.

The Marlinns are 2-2 in the division and 6-3 overall. "We haven't beaten Borgess in a long time either," Mercy coach Kristin Wright-Guinn said. "I'll take any win I can get, so they're all big in my book."

Mercury's Tessa Kuykendall scored 11 points and Ashley Hambell 10. Anne Roosevelt added seven points, Alexandra Marehall and Barb Maccka six each. Whitney Johnson five and Deidre Jones three.

Marshall also had nine rebounds and four assists; Hambell had eight rebounds and Roosevelt seven.

The Marlinns reced to a 22-13 lead after one quarter and were ahead at halftime, 36-16. The second half was even at 19 points apiece.

Tara Charles scored a game-high 20 points, and her sister, Liz Ann, added 13 for the Spartans, who have played all of their games in the division.

"They must've scouted us, because they really took away Natooha Smith," Borgess coach Jim Zbawski said, adding his team's only other experienced player had just two points. "They took away things we did well Tuesday and made us work hard on offense."

"We're happy; it was the lowest total we've given up. If we can keep it around the 50 mark, then we have a chance to win."

The Charles sisters hit a lot of outside shots as Mercy played tight defense in the post, according to Wright-Guinn. It wasn't a high-energy game like the Ladywood contest, she added.

"We're on a roll and we're going to keep it that way," Wright-Guinn said. The Ladywood win "really ignited us; that's what we needed to break down the barrier and get over the hump."

"The girls realize what hard work will do for you. They're motivated and working hard."
