
#### Reward offered

## Friends seek answers in cyclist's death

Friends who were like family to a Waterford man hope some-one traveling I-696 on Aug. 18 can help state police track down the truck driver who killed him.

Douglas John Logan, 47,
described by friends Martha
and Archie Howett of Livonia
as a 'friend, father, a respected
businessman, an enthusiastic
outdoorsman' became a traffic
statistic that rainy evening,
when the motorcycle he was
riding was struck by a truck
while he was trying to change
lanes. He had been travoling

with friends, returning from a motorcycle gathering in Fowlerville, and the group separated at the 1698ft.25 split. Moments later, police say, Logan tried to switch lanes onto the expressway and a careither bumped or forced him into his original lane. There, his motorcycle was struck by a truck that was traveling at a very high rate of speed, a witness said.

He was thrown into the center median wall and died. The truck spun sideways and, rather than stopping, the driver faced on-coming traffic and left the scene via the Novi entrance ramp, according to

Despite heavy traffic that was slowed by rain, only that one person stopped to help and talk to officers. Since August, no one has come forward with information, leaving investigators frustrated and Logan's family without answers.

"We're at a dead end," Martha Hewett said. "We haven't got any new leads People are still hurting and looking for hope and closure. We need this person to come forward."

The absence of Archie Howett's best friend of 25 years has been a large void for the whole family. Since Logan's divorce five years ago, Martha Hewett said, "he became part of our family."

"He was with us for the holidays and our daughter's gradution," she said. "We included him in everything we did."

The truck that lvit Logan is described as a white pick-up, which may have damage on the driver's side. Police found broken red tail-light lenses at the scene, indicating rear end damage to one or both of the vehicles.




