Tiles bring excitement to room

Choosing tile for your home can be an awesome task.

The good news is there's lots of exciting tile out there and plenty of experts willing to help you make wise choices.

Michigan boasts a strong tile tradition, due in large part to the influence of the historic Pewabic Pottery of Detroit. Today, many tile showrooms are located in the areas of Wayne and Oakland counties, offering everything from tumbled marble and slate to highly glazed ceramic tile.

Nancy Coucke, showroom manager for Virginia Tile in Farmington Hills, said there are "thousands" on what you can mix.

"We're seeing a lot of mixing of materials - metal with slate, glass with slate, ceramic or tumbled marble with slate," Coucke said.

"In the kitchen, tumbled mar-

ble for the backsplash can be combined with granite countertops and a tile-covered center island." The tile island in the showroom display is topped in a brilliant, indigo blue, edged in white with a small green motif running through it.

"There's tile to fit every lifestyle: French country, contemporary - any period," Coucke said. "There's also a trend toward using larger size tiles, even for backsplashes. Those require less grouting and the larger the tile you use, the larger the space will look, especially on the floor."

Many tiles come in multiple sizes. Customers may even design their own tile floor "rugs" for a particular area. Choose plain tile for the background, edge the rug in a coordinating color and design a center medallion or deep border. There are some stunning examples to start your creative juices flowing.

"Right now stone and nostalgia are big," Fawkes said. "The stone






