BRAWL DRAWS POLICE

A Farmington Hills man, 22, was treated Sept. 29 at Botsford Hospital after he was struck twice with a baseball bat in the parking lot of The Factory, 30555 Grand River.
Charged with assault in the incident was a Farmington Hills man, 24, Police confiscated a 34-inch metal softball bat, used to strike the victim in the head and the hip, according to the Farmington Hills police incident report. Police said the victim needed nine staples to close his

head wound.

An employee of the club told police he saw the assailant strike the victim with the bat. The victim told police he was assaulted while trying to break up an argument between a friend and others.


SONIC earns award
