## BRAWL DRAWS POLICE

A Farmington Hills man, 22, was treated Sept. 29 at Botsford Hospital after he was struck twice with a baseball bat in the parking lot of The Factory, 30555 Grand River.

Charged with assault in the incident was a Farmington Hills man, 24. Police confiscated a 34-inch metal softball bat, used to strike the victim in the head and the hip, according to the Farmington Hills police incident report. Police said the victim needed nine staples to close his

head wound.

An employee of the club told police he saw the assailant strike the victim with the bat. The victim told police he was assaulted while trying to break up an argument between a friend and others.

## COCAINE CONFISCATED

Farmington Hills police on Sept. 29 arrested a Redford woman, 33, for possessing cocaine and drug paraphernalia after responding to a call that she and a man were drawing

attention in a restaurant parking lot.

Police arrived at 8:58 a.m. to find the woman and the man, 43, of Hillsdale in a parked car. Upon approaching the car, the woman told police she had four outstanding warrants. A search turned up crack cocaine in her purse, police said.

Her companion was charged for possessing drug paraphernalia.

A Livonia police officer called

## SONIC earns award

Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer will join representatives of the South Oakland Narcotics Intelligence Consortium who are scheduled to receive a Special Agency Award at the International Drug Conference in October in Florida.

SONIC earned the award from the International Narcotics Enforcement Officers Association for its work to expand the unit and its success in making drug arrests.

SONIC, a consortium that includes officers from Farmington Hills, Novi, West Bloomfield and the Oakland County Sheriff's Department,

is operated and managed by the Farmington Hills Police Department.

The SONIC chiefs and Oakland County Sheriff Michael Bouchard credit and rely on federal, state and county drug units, but also recognize that cities can achieve success by forming locally operated and managed concept units.

As an example of SONIC's recent successes, officers seized 418 pounds of marijuana in Detroit, Novi and Chicago. During the first six months of 2001, SONIC arrested 94 and executed 52 search warrants.
