There is a Children's Museum where kids can dig for dinosaurs, crawl through caves or journey

If bowling isn't your style, how about Cosmo City for high tech laser games, rock climbing and virtual reality. Visit the oldest house in London, built in 1834 and now a historical museum complete with the furnishings of the period. Have traditional afternoon ten on the lawn every

Tuesday through Sunday 2-4 p.m. through the end of August. Ten is served with scenes, butter and jam for \$6 per person. Or try your hand at another pastime of the era, croquet, every Sunday from 1-4 p.m. (no charge).

Tours

Two-hour bright red double decker bus tours leave from city hall and reservations are suggested. Downtown Discovery Tours are self-guided walking tours of the architecture, landmarks and history of London. Several summer walking tours guided by the London Regional Art and Historical Museums are available to see selected neighborhoods and local history. There are also helicopter, small plane and balloon rides available mostly during the summer months.

The art scene is continuing to emerge as we speak. There are some wonderful galleries, muse-ums and stores sprinkled


