

POLICE CALLS

VANDALISM

Four Farmington residents reported property damage during the Sept. 28-29 weekend. The windshield of a 1997 Jeep Grand Cherokee was broken Sept. 28 on the passenger side with an unknown object. A window was smashed from the outside with small fragments inside. The Jeep was parked at the Farmington Plaza Apartments on Mooney.

GRAFFITI

NOT HATE GRAFFITI

Another incident of graffiti painted on a church under construction at 26600 Drake Road was discovered Oct. 3, according to a report filed with Farmington Hills police.

But in contrast to two earlier incidents where hateful graffiti

was discovered at the building site, this incident was not deemed a hate crime, according to the Farmington Hills police incident report. Sprayed on walls at the site in two places were the letters "L.V.," the report stated.

The man said that at 9 a.m. Oct. 3 a woman came to his home on Thornybrae Street. She had she was sent by the State of Michigan concerning Medicare charges, and wore what appeared to be a Medicare ID

tag. The man said he suspected a scam when the woman, described as African-American with a white male companion, also tried to sell him insurance for the United Insurance Group Agency Inc.

Firefighters, police join in 'Bridge to Bridge' walk

Firefighters and police in Farmington Hills are joining the "Bridge to Bridge" walk Oct. 11 from the Ambassador Bridge to the Brooklyn Bridge, to raise disaster relief money.

Jim Etzin, a firefighter and paramedic with the Farmington Hills Firefighters Association, said, "Anybody who's participating in the walk will be accepting pledges. The primary reason for the walk is to show our support, to demonstrate the fire services and

law enforcement solidarity."

Joining the fund-raiser for emergency services workers who died in the World Trade Center attack are the Farmington Hills Police Officers Association, Command Officers Association and Police Benevolent Association.

The walk begins at 8:45 a.m. on the Detroit side of the Ambassador Bridge. It will conclude on the Manhattan side of the Brooklyn Bridge one week later.

Walkers will symbolically pass a firefighter's helmet and tactical officer's helmet along the route so they can be presented to the City of New York. Donations will be accepted before, during and after the walk.
