Championship game marks end of era in WLAA football

Junior quarterback Brian Ceckiewicz, in his second full year of as a starter, has also shown finshes of brilliance. He completed 13 of 21 passes for 228 yards Sopt. 28 in a 24-21 overtime win over Walled Lake Central which clinched the Lakes crown for the Rockets.

One of the best WLAA championship games occurred in 1993 when Harrison beat Glenn in

two overtimes, 7-6, giving Herrington his 200th win. Harrison went on to win the Class A state title, while Glenn fell in the AA state final to Dearborn Fordson. The first time the two teams met in the WLAA final was 1985 when Glenn running back Tony Boles, who later starred at the University of Michigan, rushed for 242 yards in 28-7 Rockets victory.

"That's the most any back ever gained against us," Herrington said.

But now the shoe is on the other foot. Glenn is facing some Big Ten caliber talent.

"Nothing I've seen so far has been successful against them," Gordon said. "If you want to play ball control, that's a nice stratey. But they're so good on defense. That's often overlooked. They really don't have any weak-

nesses on defense. Everybody moves well."
Gordon can only hope he catches the Hawks on bad night and the Rockets play the game of their lives.
"We've improved everywhere this season, and our guys have played hard," Gordon said. "From a coaching standpoint, it's comforting to know they're going to play hard and give a good effort every week."
