A memorial service for Jervis Campbell Webb, 86, was held Oct. 10 at Bell Chapel in Birmingham.
Mr. Webb was born March 22, 1915 and died Oct. 7, 2001. A graduate of Massachusetts Insti-

tute of Technology, he served the Jervis B. Webb Company for more than 62 years. The company was founded by his parents, Jervis B. Webb and Maureen Campbell Webb and is headquartered in Farmington Hills.
He was a member of the board of directors for the Economic Club of Detroit, Manufacturers Association, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, American Automobile Association, First Federal Savings and the Engineering Society of Detroit.
He served as president of the Detroit Athletic Club and Conveyor Equipment Manufacturers Association.
Mr. Webb also held leadership roles in the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, Society of

Jewish Book Fair centers around Holocaust themes

The Holocaust will be among the themes at this year's annual Jewish Book Fair Nov. 8-18 at the Jewish Community Center.
Edwin Black will speak at 2:30 p.m. Nov. 11 at the Morris building in Oak Park and at 6:30 p.m. that day at the Kahn building in West Bloomfield about his newest book, *IBM and the Holocaust*. Black builds the case that IBM's corporate headquarters in New York and its president, Thomas Watson, not only helped develop the technology the Nazis needed to expedite their program of Jewish destruction but also amassed a fortune in profits doing so.
Black is author of the best-selling *The Transfer Agreement*, which won the Carl Sandburg Award for non-fiction and For-

mat Co., a Y2K technothriller.
He has been a syndicated columnist and Pulitzer Prize nominee, a foreign correspondent and freelance journalist writing primarily investigative articles for publications like *Business Week*, the *Los Angeles Times*, *Boston Globe* and *Chicago Tribune Sunday magazine*.
Cherie Bennett and Jeff Gottesfeld, authors of *Anne Frank and Me*, will speak at 6:30 p.m. Nov. 12 at the Kahn building. Based on the play of the same name, the book tells the story of Nicole Burns, who is transported back in time to Nazi-era Europe where she meets Anne Frank in a concentration camp.
Bennett is an award winning playwright, having twice won


the Kennedy Center New Visions/New Voices award for her plays for young audiences. She is also an award-winning author of books for young adults and writes a syndicated column.
With her husband, Jeff Gottesfeld, she writes for television and screen. Gottesfeld is also a composer of country songs.
Ann Weiss, author of *The Last Album: Eyes from the Ashes of Auschwitz-Birkenau* will speak at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 12 at the Morris building in Oak Park.
The daughter of Holocaust survivors, Weiss is a researcher, writer, documentary filmmaker and educator. She is founder and director of the Eyes from the Ashes Educational Foundation, an interviewer and analyst for the Transcending Trauma Sur-

vival Project at the University of Pennsylvania and has served on the Second Generation Committee of the Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C.
Her book recounts her discovery of more than 2,400 photographs taken away from concentration camp inmates.
Petra Popescu, son-in-law of Holocaust survivors, tells how love survived the hell of the concentration camps in his book, *The Oasis*. Popescu will speak at 3 p.m. Nov. 18 at the Kahn building. Popescu relates the true story of Blanka and Mirek Friedman, inmates in the deadly Dachau concentration camp, who fell in love and stayed faithful until they were reunited.
