by the material. It looks strong but is quite fragile. You could easily poke your finger right through it although I wouldn't recommend it.

This nest will not survive the winter. When cold weather arrives, most of the hornets will die. A few fomales will remain to hibernate some where underground, emerge in the spring and a build a new nest in another location.

The wind, rain and snow of winter will tear this year's nest apart. These insects are called hald-faced because they have a mostly black body with a white face. The wood they chew to make their home can come from a tree, fence post, picnic table or any other suitable wood product that attracts them. I always look forward to seeing these marvels of nature in my own yard as the seasons change.

We've just found a large ray football shaped bees

nest in a tree in our yard. What should we do about it?

From your description, this is the hive of the Bald Faced Hornet. At this time of the year, I get many calls concerning this insect because the leaves on the trees are starting to fall and the nests are becoming more visible.

If the nest is close to a doorway or in an area that children play, it may be good to take it down. Otherwise my suggestion is to leave it where it's at. Most of the time, these hornets build their nest high up in a tree. The nest may look huge but in reality what you are seeing is an outer covering that protects the smaller true hive inside.

I have not found them to be

inside.

I have not found them to be very aggressive towards people in general. This nest is gray in color because it is made up of wood which is chewed up and regurgitated into a paper pulp
