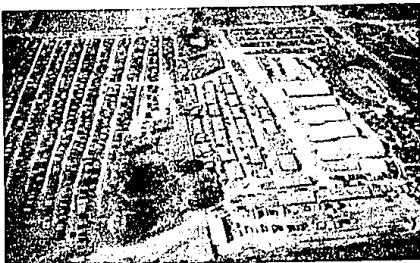

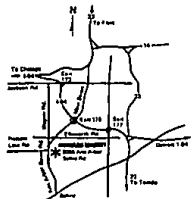

Redford Catholic Central placed five runners in the top 12 to win the 14-team Sturgis Invitational in boys cross country Saturday.

CC won with 30 points followed by Jackson Lumen Christi with 70 and Grand Rapids Christian with 104. David Lucas led the way for the Shamrocks by finishing first overall in 16:25.09 - six seconds in front of runner-up Josh Hayser of Grand Rapids Christian.

John Krawiec was third (16:37). Kyle Jekot fifth (17:00.35), Brian Doot ninth (17:14.23), Bryan Seymour 12th (17:30.67), Matt Esper 18th (17:49.71) and Dan Horgan 21st (18:02.40).

"It was kind of nice," CC coach Tony Magni said. "Dave Lucas won it and he won it by going the wrong way, coming back, falling and still beating the kids. John was third and up there all the way in really only his third race

of year. Kyle and Brian finally decided to run with leaders and stay with them; they finished well. Bryan was our fifth man and he worked hard to stay up there."

FRANKLIN 2, N. FARMINGTON 1: A solid game by Livonia Franklin put a dent in North Farmington's soccer record Monday.

Franklin defeated North for its first victory over the Raiders in six years, according to North coach Ron Meyer.

"Franklin played a real solid game," Meyer said. "They played a nice two-touch passing game. They did what they

needed to do."

"Our guys didn't come out to play. It was our senior night. The kids did not warm up well. Even though we possessed the ball 60 to 70 percent of the first half, we had just three shots."

"They had four shots in the whole game, but two of them went in and one was a penalty shot."

The Patriots (7-11-1, 2-4) took advantage of a defensive mistake by the Raiders (4-5-2, 5-5-1).

A pass-back by a defender intended for the goalkeeper wound up on the feet of Franklin's Chuck Reed, who scored with 6:03 left in the half.

North was called for a penalty in the box with 1:36 to play in the half. John Nettles shot right and caught the North goalie moving left.

The Raiders scored in the second half. Jeff Shumor clipped the ball to the far post and Greg Pekarisky beat the defenders to the ball, putting it in to make it 2-1.

North had a 9-4 edge in shots and a 4-0 edge in corner kicks in the second half but was unable to dent the net again.

"Their goalkeepers did a good job of keeping us out," Meyer said.

North plays the makeup of a rematch at Farmington Harrison at 5:30 p.m. Friday.
