## Stanton sets record in Harrison win

Senior quarterback Drew Stanton set a single-game pass-ing record Friday as Farmington Harrison's football team com-pleted an undefeated regular

plated an undefeated regular season.

Stanton passed for 334 yards, completing 13 of 17 attempts, Interrison's 420 rout of host Beverly Hills Detroit Country Day.

He broke the record held by Mill Coleman, who threw for 317 yards against Northville in 1988, his junler year at Harrison.

The Hawks, ranked No. 1 in Michigan and No. 8 nationally by Student Sports, are 9-0 with a 31-game winning streak heading into the state playoffs.
