Mercy, North among state's best in tennis

Farmington Hills Mercy and North Farmington finished among the best girls tennis teams in the state Saturday.

Mercy tied with Midland Dow for third place in the Division 1 tournament at the Midland Community Center. North was fourth and Farmington 16th in Division 2 at Holland.

"We had a great year," Mercy coach Ken Stocker said. "It's the best season Mercy has ever had."

"If a couple matches had gone a little differently, we could have won the state."

"This was the fifth year in a row that we've made it to state, but this was by far the most exciting for the kids, the families and the coaches when you're in the hunt."

Mercy's Beth Rutkowski and Kristin Walsh won the No. 3 doubles championship, overcoming a 3-6 loss in the first set to defeat Ann Arbor Pioneer's Ali Ziegler and Emily Kennedy in the next two, 6-1, 6-0. The Marlinas were seeded No. 1 and ended the season with a 30-2 record.

"Over the last three years, they've only lost six matches," Stocker said. "They started off a little nervous (in the final), but they calmed down after that and performed how they're capable of performing."

Mercy's Kerry Muldowney and Katie Bink also made it to the final at No. 4 doubles, winning three-set matches in the quarters and semis before losing to Pioneer, 6-3, 7-5.

"They had a great season, too,"

Stocker said, adding the Marlinas had beaten the Pioneers earlier in the season. "I know they would be there."

Mercy's No. 1 and 2 doubles teams were semifinalists, as was Angela Kaze at No. 2 singles. Kaze lost to the eventual state champ, Melissa Bero of Dow.

"They had a great match," Stocker said, referring to Bero's 6-4, 7-6 win. "It was a war; it was incredible. If (Kaze) had beaten her, she would have won the state championship."

Kelly Tarrier and Ashleigh Worford were unseeded at No. 2 doubles but bent the No. 2 team in the quarters before losing to Traverse City Central in three sets.

Mary Atallah and Kall Blanchard played No. 1 doubles. Lauren Davidson reached the quarterfinals at No. 3 singles.

"It was an incredible weekend for everybody," Stocker said, "and everybody who played should be proud of themselves."

North's singles players were equal to their seedings. Three of the four were seeded fourth and Kelly Davis third. All - Emily Jaffe (1), Bethany Nestor (2), Amy Berke (3) and Davis (4) - were semifinalists. Berke and Davis lost to the eventual winners.

Three of North's doubles teams - No. 1 Michele Boothroyd and Chrissy Dwyer, No. 2 Allison Key and Kimmy Soler and No. 4 Alyssa Trotsky and Sara Williams - advanced to the quarterfinal round.

Bonding Proposition

Shall the City of Farmington, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000), payable in not to exceed 20 years from the date of issue, and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds for the purpose of paying all or a part of the cost of acquiring and constructing improvements to the City's sewage disposal system consisting generally of rehabilitation of the primary sewer interceptor pipe that connects Farmington to the Detroit Wastewater Treatment System by inserting a liner inside the current pipe together with all appurtenances and attachments reasonably necessary therefor? The estimated millage to be levied in 2002 is .34 mills (\$.34 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds is .34 mills (\$.34 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS SHALL BE PAYABLE FROM FUNDS OF THE CITY LEGALLY AVAILABLE THEREFOR, INCLUDING AD VALOREM TAXES LEVIED IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO PAY SAID PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST, WHICH LEVY MAY BE IN EXCESS OF CHARTER TAX RATE LIMITS.

All qualified and registered electors may vote on the above bonding proposition.

Any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write, may be given assistance by two inspectors who have expressed a preference for different political parties.

A blind person may be assisted by a member of his or her immediate family or by any designated person 18 years or older.
