She explained that mall management reviews its policy about trick-of-treating on an annual basis. But recent anthrax ill-nesses (confirmed and hoaxes) have forced the mall to cancel the event this year.

"It's always something we've had to look at every year, in terms of trick-or-treating," Gelman said. "This year, it was heightneed because of national events."
