KIRK IN THE HILLS

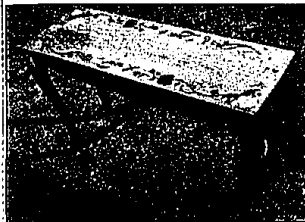

William Tyndale College hosts "Nation in Crisis", a look at the Middle East, Islam, and why this crisis exists, from 7-9 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 8.

Free to everyone, it will feature Judith Mendelsohn Rod, professor of history and Middle East studies at Tyndale. Rod earned a Ph.D. at the University of Chicago. She undertook her dissertation research at the Islamic Court in Jerusalem where she researched the role of the Muslim community in Jerusalem during the reign of Muhammad Ali (1831-40). Before joining Tyndale, she worked as a congressional intern on Capitol Hill, studied at Hebrew University.
