Each swimmer achieved a personal best in at least one event, and many had personal bests in multiple events. Several achieved new time cuts, moving from C

to B or B to A.

The CAST Pentathlon requires all swimmers (except 8-and-under novices) to participate in five events (butler, backstroke, breaststroke, freestyle and individual medley). The 8-and-under novice swimmers participate in three events (50 freestyle, 25 backstroke, and 25 freestyle).

Points are awarded to the top 30 swimmers in each event based on place finish. Points are summed across all events to determine total points for each swimmer. Awards are given based on total points. Trophies were given to the top six in each age group, with medals to seventh through 12th places and ribbons to 13th through 24th places.
